
































Don Woodward has served as the General Manager at Packaging Corporation of America (PCA) in Roanoke, VA for over 34 years. Mr. Woodward's career with PCA started in 1974 by obtaining a job in the receiving department (formerly known as Dixie Container Corporation) in High Point, NC.
